



Georgia's Home Energy Rebates

Bringing **energy efficiency** to Georgians.

REBATE PROGRAMS

The state of Georgia has been allocated \$220 million by the U.S. Department of Energy for Georgia's Home Energy Rebates. These rebates are intended to help reduce the cost of energy-saving retrofits, improve the comfort of participant homes, and expand the network of certified contractors throughout the state.

Georgia's Home Energy Rebates provide households with incentives for the purchase and installation of electric appliances, insulation, air sealing, HVAC, and other improvement measures. Eligible households can get up to \$16,000 in savings depending on their household income and/or expected energy savings.

GEORGIA ENVIRONMENTAL FINANCE AUTHORITY

Founded in 1986, the Georgia Environmental Finance Authority (GEFA) directs programs that improve Georgia's environment, protect natural resources, and promote economic development. GEFA provides loans for water, wastewater, and solid waste infrastructure; manages energy efficiency and renewable energy programs; administers land conservation loans; and monitors state-owned fuel storage tanks.

Georgia's Home Energy Rebates

REBATES AVAILABLE



Home Efficiency Rebates (HER)

The Home Efficiency Rebates address energy efficiency improvements. Higher rebates are available for households that meet specific income qualifications. The rebate will depend on the amount of energy saved and the income eligibility of the household occupants.

Estimated Energy Savings	Household Area Medium Income (AMI)*	Rebate Cap (% of Project Cost)	Max Rebate Amount
20% - 34%	Less than or equal to 80%	98%	\$10,000
Greater than or equal to 35%	Less than or equal to 80%	98%	\$16,000
20% - 34%	Greater than 80%	50%	\$2,000
Greater than or equal to 35%	Greater than 80%	50%	\$4,000

*Area Medium Income (AMI) refers to the midpoint of a region's household income distribution as determined annually by HUD.

Home Electrification and Appliance Rebates (HEAR)

The Home Electrification and Appliance Rebates will provide point-of-sale rebates to households with income less than 150 percent of the Area Median Income (AMI) in their county. Rebates will apply to multiple appliances and measures.

Approved Upgrade	Max Rebate Amount
Heat pump water heater	\$1,750
Heat pump for space heating or cooling	\$8,000
Electric stove, cooktop, range, oven, heat pump clothes dryer	\$840
Electric load service center	\$4,000
Insulation, air sealing, and ventilation	\$1,600
Electric wiring	\$2,500
Total allowed rebate combination	\$14,000
